Workforce Needs Drive Legislation




The Morrill Act of 1862

- Created land grant universities
- Extended technology to farmers
- Educated Union Officers for the Civil War




Serviceman's Readjustment Act of 1944

- Commonly known as the GI Bill.
- Develop robust workforce and retrain military men into civilian workers.
- As of 1987, \$60 billion has been distributed under the GI Bill.




Russians Launch Sputnik, 1958

- Space race with the Soviet Union
- National Defense Student Loans (NDSL) are created and aimed at developing mathematicians, scientist, engineers and teachers.



The Great Society, 1964-65


- Student financial aid aimed to help low-income students:
 - have a prominent role in workforce
 - take care of their families with dignity
- Programs include College Work Study, Guaranteed Student Loan, and the Educational Opportunity Grant.






Legislation of the 1980's & 90's

 - Life-time learning credit


Cost of Education - All Institutions









% Share of Grants vs. Loans, 1980-81 to 1997-98








