1. Correct FAFSA Template

1.1 General Description

All data fields for correction are following the process specified below except the Federal School Codes and Housing Plan. For implementations of Federal School Codes and Housing Plan, please see section 3.

The Correction is generated based on one question each page. An instruction is displayed on top of the page. The question, previous entered answer, input for new answer, and the action options are displayed afterwards. The Correct FAFSA table lists the available action options and corresponding instruction for each question based on the question number.

When the correction is applied to a question that contains a worksheet (such as question 64 for Parent household worksheet), both the question and the worksheet will be displayed. However, only the question input field will display the previous value. The previous values for fields in the worksheet are blank, because the input for worksheet is not captured by the system.

1.3 Code for Action Options

- B** – Blank = This indicates that the field can be corrected to blank by the Applicant. Correctable to blank fields write an ‘*’ to the COTW database table.
- V** – Verifiable = This indicates that the field can be verified by the Applicant. Verifiable fields write the same data to the COTW database table.
- P** – Populated = This indicates data is being displayed to the user which comes from an outside source, this column indicates that field can be populated with said outside data.
